Married-Smith-Robinson(should be Robertson)--at the residence of the bride's father, Allen Robinson(Robertson) in Long Hollow on the evening of the 17th Dec 1873, by the Rev. W. T. Andrews, Mr. Wn. Smith, of Larkins-ville to Miss Sue(Susan Ellen) Robinson.(this couple buried Smith's Chapel cem, Aspel, Ala. Their t.s. read:

"Susio E., wife of Dr. W. B. Smith(stone broken in half)

Born Feb. 20th, 1852, Died Nov. 10, 1892.."

"Dr. W. B. Snith, born June 9, 1849, Died July 27, 1902."

(He was William B. Smith, son of Preston and Judith A. E. Smith.

Susan Ellen Robertson was the day of Allen P. and Elizabeth (Staples) Robertson. I have xerox copy of their old Bible record. Allen and Elizabeth Robertson were married in Huntland, Franklin county, Tenn, 1847. They came to Jackson County and settled in Long Hollow-Sauta community about 1848-49. They were in Jackson county when 1850 census was taken. It reads:

Robison, Allen 28 Ga. farmer Robison, Elizabeth 28 Tenn Robison Matilda 1 Tenn(Matilda Jane)

Elizabeth Staples was the day of Isaac Staples and Jane Larkin, day of Revolutionary soldier, David Larkin. This couple buried in the old Larkin cem near Huntland, Franklin Co., Tenn(see our vol. 2 for this com) January 24, 1879.... "Mr. I. P. Staples, "gentle Ike," from Hunt's Station, Tenn, gave us a call last Monday. (undated clipping) Married..at Hunt's Station, Tenn July 1st, 1879, Mr. Cary A. Staples of this vicinity and Mrs. Lizzie Allen, of Hunt's station. (Cary bro. to Elizabeth Staples Robertson. They also had a bro John. Cary is buried in the old Staples cem behind Congressman Bob Jones home on Old Larkinsville Road. Cary was married more than once and at least one of his wives are buried beside him in the old Staples com. One John Staples also buried there. It is not known if he is the brother of Cary but probably so).

From an undated Scottsboro newspaper clipping...

"OVERHAULED. A man by the name of Pace, was arrested near this place with a fine gray horse stolen from Col. Pete. Turney, and also another animal in his possession. He was carried back to Winchester, Tenn by Cary A. Staples and others and lodged him in Jail. The impression is that he belongs to an organized of robbers."

Non-resident notice...ANNIS LILLY et als complainants, No. 308. vs CARY A. STAPLES, adm'r debonis non of MARY PARKS, dec'd et als defendants...In Chancery at Scottsboro, 9th District, Northern Division of Ala. (may have been Mary was Elizabeth Mary Larkin, wife of John W. Parks)

In this cause it appears to the Register from the affidavit of James W. Lawber, appended to the bill of complaint, that the defendants John H. McCutchen and Elizabeth McCutchen, are non-residents of this State and that they reside in the county of Johnson, State of Texas, and that their post office address is Cleburne, said county and State, and further, in the belief of said affiant, the said defendants are over the age of twenty one years; etc., etc.,

Nov. 14th, 1871... The deceased, lived in Gadsden, Ala., she was sister of Mrs. A. Snodgrass, by whom and all of her family, she was most tenderly beloved, and the sudden and unexpected tidings of her death overwhelms our household with grief. We had, only three days ago, received letters from her dated 6th and 7th inst. of tenderness and affection, and expressing a hope that she would soon have the pleasure of visiting us. such is life and the futility of Earthly hopes! We had no news of her sickness and have no particulars of her death. Her age was 31 years -- she leaves a husband and three children, whose loss can never be supplied on Earth. Mrs. Golightly as a wife, mother, sister and relation, as a neighbor and friend, was, in all essential respects, a superior woman -- Her loss will be felt and mourned outside of her family circle. cannot express the gricf of those who were bound to her by the tiew of near relationship.

LATER.

Just as we go to press, a letter received by Mrs. Snodgrass

from Capt. A. L. Woodliff of Gadsden, from Chattanooga, Tenn. written yesterday, states that Mrs. G. died suddenly of congestion on Sunday evening at 4 o'clock-that Willie, her second daughter died at 12 o'clock on Tuesday and that Mollie, her oldest daughter was lying very low with pneumonia."

OBITUARY

MRS. SALLIE C. DAVIDSON (from old newspaper clipping) Mrs. Sallie C. Davidson died at her home in Scottsboro, Ala. Feb 19th, 1874, she was the daughter of Thos and Caroline Snodgrass, was born September 29th, 1847. She professed religion and joined the C.P. Church in early life, but soon after joined the M. E. Church South, of which she remained an acceptable member during life. She was happily united in marriage to Mr. T. M. Davidson, January 19th, 1871. She was especially noted for a quiet uniform and consistant character. She was habitually pious, thus exhibiting the good effects of her carly parental religious training. Her little infant girl (Maybel) although only about two years old, still remembers, and can point out the very sp ot where she has seen her "mama" pray. Only a few days after she saw her mother buried, while in the parlor with her grandnother, she stooped down and placing her little hand on the carpet near the centre table, and looking up into her grandmother's face, she said "here where

mama prayed." Oh! what a lesson to mothers. circumstance teaches two important facts, first, that she did not neglect to take her little child with her to private devotion, and secondly, that the impressions of those seasons of prayer were not lost on that little mind, although it had been several months perhaps since she had seen her mother kneel there, as she has been too much afflicted to leave her room for sometimes She was one of those mothers who believe it is right to consecrate their children to God and the Church by baptism, and acted accordingly, and ever afterwards endeavored to impress these sacred lessons that the ordinance brings with it. Another specialty in her general character was that she was scrupulously conscientious in all matters of morality and religion, so much so that she could not tolerate anything that had the slightest appearance of deception. To know her one day was to know her the next also, for she was so eminently sincere that first acquaintance was always a true index to her character. I might enlarge in just eulogies of the dead, for she was in most respects indeed a model for any community, but the unacceptibility of lengthy obituary notices warns me to desist. We may truthfully say that the community has lost a most estimable and accomplished lady, the church an acceptable member, the mother a dutiful daughter, the brothers and sisters a very affectionate sister, the husband a devoted companion, but who sustains a greater loss among all these than the innocent

unconscious prattling babe. May she live to adorn society by imitating her mother's virtues, for a life of modest piety admonishes us that our loss is her gain. Stbore 2-23-1874, W. T. Andrews.

Died in Maynard's Cove last Sunday, Mr. James Roden, Sr. aged 45 years. His death is deeply regretted by his many friends, also on Thursday, of last week, Mrs. James Roden, Jr., a worthy, good lady.

Died in Maynard's Cove, one day last week, Mr. Wm. L. Holland, ("Buck") aged about sixty-five years. The deceased was born and raised in the Cove, and was one of our best and most respected citizens. He was an unright, honorable gentleman, and his death will be a severe loss to the community in which he lived so long, and where he spent a happy, useful life. Mr. Holland, we believe, belonged to the Cumberland Presbyterian church, and was a member of a large and influential family connection. Peace to his dust. Our old land marks are gradually passing away."

"William A. Clark and his family left Jackson County following the death of son Carruthers and moved to Lockhart (Caldwell County) Texas and remained there the rest of their lives."

Letter to Mrs. Bill Sumner, February 20, 1971, from C. A. Welborn, 606 W. Church, Apt. 2, Greenwood, Miss 38930
"I am trying to establish the relationship between aquilla Welborn(Wilborn-Welbourne, etc.,) and Elias Welborn who were in Jackson County by 1830 and Elias possibly earlier. Were they brothers? cousins? or related at all? Qquilla (Quiller) is believed to be the son of Gideon Welborn who went to Barren County, Ky., 1806 from North Carolina with three brothers and families and their father,

James. Soveral facts indicate that Elias was likely a son of Gideon also, but have no legal evidence. The 1850 Jackson County census shows three sons of Aquilla were Starnes, Elias and James. 1860 census, Jackson County shows Aquilla and wife in household No.61, Div. 4 and living in households adjoining were each of the three sons, Starnes, Elias and James.

"Elias Welborn was on Eastern Side of Range on 1830 census and P. O. was Coffeville(later Langston), where he died December, 1864. His three sons were William Starnes, James L. and Geo. W. He had grandsons named

Starnes and Elias -- names used in each generation.

"The family began scattering after the Civil War and it is hard to establish facts concerning the early generations. I shall be glad to exchange data."

The following information taken from letter to Mrs. Bill Sumner, 22 Nov 1970 from G. B. Floyd(Garvis), Box DG, Homeland, California 92348...Wanted following information on Enoch Floyd, Sr.:

The names of his parents: county and date of birth in S. C.; date and place of his death and burial. Mr. Floyd said, "A son of Enoch Floyd, Sr., Alva Waters Floyd("my great grandfather") and his family embarked on a flatboat on the Tennessec River, Larkins Landing, for Northwest Arkansas in early 1859. I assume they traveled up the Tennessec to the Mississippi and down the Mississippi

to the Arkansas and up the Arkansas to Ozark. (See the book, "A Reminiscent History of the Ozark Region"-C.S.) On March 5, 1859, they landed at Ozark, Franklin County, Arkansas, where the parents lived out the remainder of their lives. Alva Waters Floyd died 18 August 1881. Catherine McAnally, his wife, died 24 Feb 1894. Both are buried in the McAnelly Cemetery north of Ozark, Franklin County, Arkansas.

"None of the Arkansas Floyds, including mc, knew the names of the parents of Alva Waters Floyd until last year when I found a letter in the Floyd file of the State Library in Nashville which gave these names and stated that Alva Waters Floyd was born in Bedford county, Tenn in 1816. A subsequent visit to Bedford county revealed no information whatever."

Another letter from this same Mr. Floyd, dated April 1, 1971, states: "ENOCH FLOYD, Sr. & Shook, Waters, Holland, Garrets and Allied families:

lst generation: Harmonous Shook born ca 1729, died 1789, emigrated from Holland to Phila.Pa. then to Augustus Co., Va by 1750. His will Hardy County, Va mentions wife but not her name.

2nd generation: His son: William Shook, Sr., born abt 1745 in Va. died Knox county, Tenn about 1811. Married Catherine Sears in Va., date unknown (brother and sister of Wn. Shook given but we did not cony.")

3rd generation: Their son: William Shook, Jr., born Dec 11, 1767, Hamshire Co., Va(now West Va) d. 1840 aged 73 in Bedford Co., Tenn in 1810, settled near Shelbyville, Tonn. Eleanor Waters, daughter of Elsie and Jonathan Waters. Eleanor Waters b. April 9, 1770, d. ?. Bible also gives births of 10 children of Eleanor and William Shook, Jr. and several marriages including children. 4th generation: Anna Waters Shook, born Nov 16, 1794 m. on 23 Sept 1813 to Enoch Floyd, Sr., b. ca 1795 S. C. d.____ 5th generation: Their son: Enoch Newton Floyd, Jr. b. ca 1829, d. n. on 24 Dec 1873 by William Bellomy, M. G. to Martha Rowena Holland, b. Jackson County, Alabama, died , Jackson County, Alabama, day of Wm. Davis Holland and wife Polly, at residence of her fother in Maynard's Cove near Scottsboro, Ala. Mrs. Martha Rowena Holland (Floyd) the day of W. D. Holland and wife of Enoch N. Floyd, Jr, died in Jackson Co., Ala aged 19 on 23 Aug 1875. (this quote from the CITIZEN, Scottsboro newspaper). Martha R. and Enoch R. (N.?C.S.) Floyd, Jr. had at loast one son: Walter Floyd, b. _____d. ____, m. Emma They had 3 sons: Homer, Earl, Lester. Last two living around Scottsborn today. Kirby, the birth dates of his wife and children, the death dates of his parents and the request for monuments to be placed over the graves of his parents are all in the handwriting of Hugh G. Kirby. The death dates of

Hugh G. and Flora A. Kirby, Addic Kirby Sawyer and Hugh Parks Kirby were written by Winnie Davis Kirby Moore.

The death date of Grady Kirby was written by Incz J.

Murphy.

The "Jr." on the name of Richard L. Kirby's death date is an error. He was not a son of Richard L. Kirby, Sr. Richard Laurence Kirby and his wife, Eliza Brown Parks do have white marble grave markers. They are buried in a "Kirby Family Cometery" on "Backbone Ridge," southwest of Scottsboro, Alabama(note by Sumner: this com located across rd from my home and adjoins the golf & country club property. I have copy of it. Located on Guntersville hwy.) Their two sons, Joseph Porter Kirby and John Parks Kirby are buried in the same cometery. Joseph Porter Kirby died suddenly when he was about two years old. A slave girl confessed on her deathbed that a horse kicked him in the head while his parents were away from home."

"John Parks Kirby married Jane Gullatt. After his death, his widow moved to $T_{\rm C}$ xas to raise her family. (incomplete record on this family-Mrs. Murphy)

Lucinda Jane Kirby married John Jenkins in 1861. They had seven children: namely, Eliza Lee, William Porter, Addie Lenora, Sallie P., Hortense Beaucharnais, Annie Vashti and Myrtle Hemans Jenkins. (See Jenkins family Bible records).

John Jenkins and Lucinda Jane Kirby were buried in the Frazier Cemetery near Goosepond. Their graves were moved to Cedar Hill Cemetery(the main cem in Scottsboro) in 1966. (The Frazier Cemetery was located on Goosepond Island where the present Revere Aluminum plant is located. Through the effords of Mrs. Murphy and Mr. Julian Clemons of Scottsboro, the old cemetery was not bulldozed off but moved, all the graves, to Cedar Hill-C.S.) Hugh G. and Flora A. John Lindsay had six children by Nancy Walker. They
were: Francis(some question as to m or female, I think
probably male as shown in 1850 census Jacksom county and of "unsound mind."

Other children of John Lindsay and his wift Nancy were Sarah, Rufus, George, Covington and John. These last children were reared in the West somewhere. No record has been found of their descendants by this writer. John Lindsay, born May 12, 1789, was the great, great, great, great, great, greatfather of Christine Summer.

John Lindsay's son Noah, built the house in Denison, Texas, where Dwight David Eisenhower was born. It is now a National Museum. Some of the Lindsay's belongings are still in the house.

Noah Lindsay's wife was Francis Mario Deveraux Jesse Check Walker, sister of Nancy Walker Lindsay, wife of John.

An excerpt of a letter from Noah to his brother William Ranson Lindsay February 15, 1874, dated at "Snow Hill, Texas" says: "Frances has very good health. We have only two children with us, Sallie and Johnie our youngest girl and baby boy. We have five girls married; Mat, Mollie, Beadie, Tishic and Amanda to the following: Redding, Darby, Loveing, Bridges and Shaw. Frances and myself and Mat, Beadie and Amanda belongs to the Missionary Baptist Church. Much love to all your family; also to Manerva's (1) family. What is Tip(Samuel Tipton Lindsay son of Manerva Tipton Lindsay and her husband Lewis Ervin Lindsay) doing now? We haven't heard from him in a long time. as ever your brother and Sister N. C. Lindsay F. M. Lindsay"

(1) Mancrya was the widow of Lewis Ervin Lindsay, son of John and brother to Moah and William Ransom Lindsay. Lowis Ervin Lindsay was a Copt. of Company K, 4th Alabama Infantry Regiment raised by him at Larkinsville, Alabama. He was killed at the first battle of Manassas in Virginia. His body was brought back to Larkinsville, Jackson County, Alabama, for burial. He is buried in an unmarked grave beside his daughter Alvenia Lindsay, wife of Thomas V. Warren. She has a tombstone.
