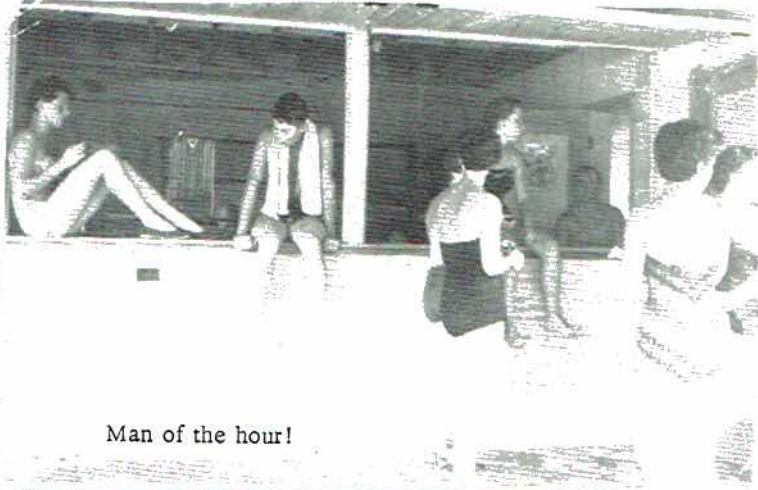
The next morning I returned to Scottsboro, got in my automobile, and made my way back home. I enjoyed the trip immensely but am glad to be safely at home with my family.
