





Mr. Harding is the person responsible for the Academic Excellence Program. He found out about this program at a principals' meeting in Huntsville. After that, he inquired further and did more re-

chemical engineering classes at the University. Jennifer's proud parents are J. D. and Linda Shrader of Stevenson.


















