In July 1943 a new future opened its doors to a group of eager boys and girls when they entered school for their first day. Only eight of those students are finishing school from Pisgah High this year. They are Polly Matthews, Bobby Maynor, Billy Baine, Kathryn Roden, Bobby Jenkins, Paul Johnson, Sanford Liles and Stakely Moses.

Pauline Tiffin from Scottsboro joined the class in the second grade. As the class moved forward to the third grade Tommie Sue White of Deans Chapel and Brent Peek of Roaslie joined the group.

In the fourth grade came Shelby Davis from Chattanooga, Paul Roach from Sublets and Nancy Roberts of Roaslie.

From Sublets came Guiendell King in the fifth grade. Peggy Travis transferred from Macedonia in the sixth grade.

As the class entered Junior High School, Overia Tinker, Albert Tinker and Dennis Shavers came from Subletts. Willo Dean Wheeler of Scottsboro, Dearl Hughes of Deans Chapel and Wayne Webster of Pleasant View joined the class. Mary McCamy of Scottsboro came in the eighth grade.

As we moved into our sophomore year, Mary Francis Adams, Barbara Goforth, Jo Ann Moore, Jimmy Cordell, Eugene Gamble, Hugh Lyda and James Millican entered from Flat Rock; Betty Barton and Charles Bell from Bryant; Clo Dean Brown, Glenn Dobbins, and Gene Wade of Mount Olive. Janice Weaver, Kenneth Deerman, Teddy Traylor and Billy York of Dutton. Barbara Campbell, Iris Everett, Emma Richey, Jo Ann Thornhill, Covie Hendricks, Bobby Wright of Rosalie. Laurie Lee Coady and Maxell Sims of Henagar and Louise Brewton of Stevenson entered the class. Betty Jo Cookson of Jasper, Tennessee joined us in our junior year.

In our Senior year, Shirley Frazier of Sylvania, Patsy Miller of Pepperell, Tennessee, Esmond Shelton, Wilson Wilbourn and Donnie Walden of Scottsboro joined the class.

Class Prophecy

Returning one night from a late visit to a friend, I was passing a supposedly deserted house when the sound of happy voices reached my ears. When I turned to investigate I found that the house had vanished and I stood before my old Alma Mater, Pisgah High School. The year is 1965.

I bid Dearl farewell and go uptown, only to pause before a store bearing the sign, "Gamble, Lyda, Millican, Genuine Imitation Furs," Bobby Wright emerges from the store and tells me that he bought a coat for his wife instead of a car because he couldn't find anyone selling imitation automobiles.

At a news stand I buy a daily paper (Glen Dobbins, Editor). I see that Teddy Traylor is to lecture on the Importance of Good Sportsmanship.

I also learn that Brent Peek is the new owner of the Bama Theater. The current movie is a musical starring Patsy Miller.

Next to the news stand is the office of Gene Wade, Attorney at Law. Well!

Pisgah now has a National Guard Unit. As I pass the armory I see Donnie Walden drilling his men.

A bright array of flowers in the window of Cordell's Florist Shop catches my eye. Joann Thornhill, the saleslady, tells me that Jimmy grows the flowers and Barbara arranges them.

I decided to remain in Pisgah overnight, so I go to the City library to get a book to read. I am not greatly surprised to find Louise Brewton giving orders to the assistant librarian, Willow Dean Wheeler.

On my way to the hotel I stop at the First National Bank to cash a check. Tommie Sue White, the cashier, tells me that Bobby Jenkins is the President, and Dennis Shavers is the Vice President. Clo Dean Brown and Betty Barton are their secretaries.

As I leave the bank I see a blue uniformed figure directing traffic. Kenneth Deerman is busily preserving the human race.

Upon arrival at the hotel, I learn that Truman Roberts and Bobby Moore are the owners. When I order supper sent up, I received greetings from Jo Ann Moore, the hotel switch-board operator.

Next morning I stop at a Clinic to see Wayne Webster, a doctor. I also see Shelby Davis and Shirley Frazier, who are nurses.


At a garage I am greeted by Esmond Shelton and Wilson Wilborn. They tell me that they own the garage.

Billy York is the next person I meet. He is pastor of the First Methodist Church. He tells me that Billy Baine has just been elected mayor of Pisgah.




As I leave my two friends, a truck loaded with farm produce rambles by. I recognize its occupants, Stakely Moses and Charles Bell.

Varsity Basketball


