Now, the few of us who have survived the pitfalls along the road are Seniors. Throughout the year, Mrs. Armine Hambrick has been our sponsor. She has tried to smooth off the rough edges and put on a final polish to our high school education. We appreciate the things she has done for us and will try to follow the principles she has taught us.

We are very proud of our achievement, toward which we have worked so earnestly for twelve years; but we are sorry, too, that we will soon be leaving the school where we have spent so many happy hours, not only in play, but also in work. We realize, however, that we are just beginners in the school of life, and that we have much to learn.
